The national Paediatric Sepsis Webinar, hosted by the Queensland Paediatric Sepsis Program and Sepsis Australia, will be held on 16 April in the week leading up to Paediatric Sepsis Week 20-26 April.

The webinar will feature Dr Luregn Schlabach, Professor of Paediatric Intensive Care at the University of Zurich as key speaker on the Phoenix Criteria, a tool used to evaluate sepsis and septic shock in paediatric patients.



Facilitated by the James Lind Alliance, these collaborations aim to identify key uncertainties about sepsis from the perspectives of patients, carers, and clinicians, culminating in a top 10 list of critical research targets.


National Sepsis Program Update

The George Institute, Sepsis Australia, and the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care are collaborating on delivering Phase 2 of the National Sepsis Program to build on previous achievements. Phase 2 of the program is focussed on public awareness, healthcare worker education, coordinated care principles, post-sepsis support, a national data plan, and enhancing sepsis response for First Nations people.
